Dear Friends of 4C,

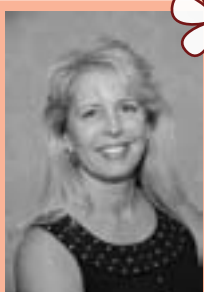
