Child Identity Theft - Data Security Risk - When someone uses a child's personal information to steal money or open accounts.

Children are at high risk because they usually do not have a credit record yet. That can make identity theft harder to notice.

This theft can go unnoticed for years. Families may find out later when the child applies for a job, housing, a loan, or a first credit card. Experts suggest checking a child's credit report every year.

Questions to Answer
(Ask Your Internet Service Provider (ISP) for Assistance)

For unique company controlled email addresses:

1. How many total email addresses would be needed to cover all staff working HS/EHS contracted services at each site?
2. What are the total number of email addresses that can be setup with my existing company plan?
3. How many of those are currently in use?
4. If more email addresses are needed than the number available on my current plan, what are the options?
5. What is the time needed to get additional email addresses?
6. How do I complete the setup of these email addresses?
